

#### Dates

The Audi quattro Winter Games NZ runs from 21-30 August. Full sports programme below:





#### Host towns & venues

The event is based across the 3 towns of Queenstown, Wanaka and Naseby in the South Island of New Zealand. The Curling Tournament will take place in the Maniototo Curling Rink in Naseby, the mountain events at Cardrona Alpine Resort (Freeskiing & Snowboarding), Coronet Peak (Alpine Skiing) and Snow Farm NZ (Cross Country Skiing) and the downtown festival events in the Queenstown and Wanaka Event Villages.

#### Alpine Ski Racing venue - Coronet Peak, Queenstown

Coronet is just a 25 min drive from Queenstown township and International Airport. Coronet Peak is the venue for all FIS and IPC Alpine Ski Racing and is also hosting the Opening Ceremony for the Audi quattro Winter Games NZ, which will feature an exciting Alpine dual slalom event. The elite component of this has a \$30,000 prize pool – please see below for more information. There will not be training space available at Coronet Peak for 2015, however there are a number of other training venues in the region. See below. www.nzski.com

## Entries & Lift Tickets

#### **Entries & Entry Fees**

All entries must be submitted via the IPC online system. Please refer to the official race notice for deadlines. Entry fees will be NZ \$50 per event payable in cash at the first Team Captain's Meeting for each race.

#### Lift Tickets

Lift tickets will be free for competitors on the days they are racing and for coaches of competitors with 1 ticket per 8 same team athletes or part thereof and 50% charge of a day pass for remaining coaches. These complimentary lift tickets will be issued at the beginning of the Team Captain's Meeting for each race.

## Classification

Winter Games NZ and Snow Sports NZ will be running physical classification on Saturday 22 and Sunday 23 August at Queenstown Medical Centre, before the Southern Hemisphere Cup races. Please not that there will be no VI classification as we do not have the necessary facilities in the area. #### Visas

New Zealand has a special policy for athletes, coaches, administrators, officials and support staff visiting the country to participate in sporting events. Please check on: www.immigration.govt.nz/ migrant/stream/visit/visitors/quickcheck. htm to find out if visitors from your country require a visitor visa to enter New Zealand. Application forms for visitor visas are available on www.immigration. govt.nz or from New Zealand and Australian Consulates, Embassies or High commissions.

#### Liability & Insurance

All athletes, officials and members of the National Associations who attend and participate in the event shall do so at their own risk. Winter Games NZ, sponsors and suppliers, their agents, employees and volunteers shall not be responsible for any

losses or injuries incurred or suffered by the athletes, official or other person in conjunction with the organising or staging of the event. Public Liability Insurance (CHF) 3 million, for the period of the event, is in place.

If you are injured in New Zealand (including whilst competing in a competition), you may need the assistance of the Accident Compensation Corporation (ACC), New Zealand's accident compensation scheme. ACC helps pay for your care - and that means paying towards the cost of your treatment and helping your recovery while you remain in New Zealand. ACC will not cover any medical or related costs arising from the accident after you leave New Zealand. You will accordingly still need to arrange your own travel and medical insurance. New Zealand's medical facilities. are not free to visitors except as a result of an accident but even in the case of an accident, surcharges in private facilities will apply.

#### Air travel

We recommend that you book your flights as early as possible and fly into Queenstown or Christchurch depending on your travel plans. Air New Zealand, Jetstar, Qantas and Virgin Australia are the only airlines flying directly into Queenstown. However many others come into Auckland, Wellington and Christchurch.

## Training Opportunities

We have listed a variety of venues below with locations and contact information to assist you with your planning. We recommend that you enquire directly with the venues regarding lane space, pricing and package deals. There will be a number of international teams training in New Zealand at the same time and lane space is in high demand, so we recommend that you plan ahead and book your space now.

#### Cardrona Alpine Resort, Wanaka

Cardrona is a relaxed and friendly ski and snowboard resort located between Queenstown and Wanaka with an adaptive race programme and excellent training facilities. It is 35 min drive from Wanaka and 50 min from Queenstown International Airport. Cardrona's facilities are fully accessible at base and with chairlifts. There is limited ski racing lane space available and early bookings are required.

#### The Remarkables, Queenstown

The Remarkables is the sister field to Coronet Peak located 40 minutes drive from Queenstown and 30 min from the International Airport. Though not a traditional ski race training area, the resort will provide training options for the IPC teams in 2015. Full length GS and Slalom training space is available on Sugar Bowl and Shadow Basin. Chairlifts service all training areas. The Remarkables run an adaptive programme.

#### Mt Hutt, Canterbury

1 ½ hour drive from Christchurch International Airport and 5 hours from Queenstown. Methven is a small ski town and used as a main base for athletes. Mt Hutt hosts a number of ski races including the IPC Super G and Super Combined and is a preferred training facility for many international race teams. It has accessible facilities and chairlifts that service all runs for training. It has limited disabled parking but has a drop off area next to the base building.
