



IPC Eligibility code form for athletes – version 5

For athlete competing in IPC Winter Sports: IPC Alpine Skiing, IPC Ice Sledge Hockey, IPC Cross Country Skiing and Biathlon, IPC Snowboard

The updated version of the IPC Eligibility code form (ECF), version 5, requires that ALL athletes wishing to be licensed for winter season 2016-2017 have to sign the IPC Eligibility code form - version 5 and NPC/NF has to upload it to SDMS prior to initiating licensing process for the athlete. This is not only relevant to athletes about to be newly registered in SDMS for the first time but it is also relevant to all athletes that are already registered in SDMS but want to become licensed for 2016-2017, and therefore plan to compete in winter season 2016-2017. Athletes who do not have the IPC Eligibility code form - version 5 uploaded to SDMS will not be permitted to apply for IPC winter sports licence and therefore will not be able to compete in IPC winter sports recognized competitions.


The process is as follows:

- Download IPC Eligibility code form, version 5 from here:

- Ask your athletes to fill it in and sign it (for underage athletes signature of parent or legal guardian is mandatory as well)
- Upload PDF version to SDMS. Please ensure the document is scanned in quality that meets the standard set out in [SDMS Manual](#). The upload of ECF version 5 will re-complete the registration process of the athlete and the responsible IPC sport will check the quality and correct signatures before the athlete can be licensed

I understand that as an athlete licensed to compete in IPC Competitions, I am participating in events which have ongoing international and historical significance, and as a condition of being licensed to compete and in consideration of the acceptance of my participation in IPC competitions I agree as follows;

- to be filmed, televised, photographed, identified and otherwise recorded during any IPC Competition, the IPC and anyone authorised by the IPC shall be entitled to keep these images and to use them for any purpose in relation to the promotion of the Paralympic Movement;
- that all photographs and moving images taken by me at any IPC Competition, including those of athletes competing within any official venue during these competitions, shall be used solely for personal and non-commercial purposes, unless prior written consent is obtained from the IPC;
- to comply with the IPC Handbook, the IPC Sports Technical Rules and Classification Rules of the sport in which I am participating, and any other rules or regulations that apply to my participation at an IPC Competition (hereinafter referred to as 'the IPC Sport Rules'). These documents can be found on or linked through the IPC website or can be obtained upon written request to the IPC Headquarters and I understand that I am deemed to have read and understood them;
- that my entries to IPC Competitions will be administered through my National Paralympic Committee (NPC) or IPC recognised National Sport Federation (if applicable);
- to accept the criteria of eligibility, qualification and participation laid down by the IPC for the various IPC Competitions;
- to abide by the principles of fair-play and non-violence and to behave myself accordingly during the IPC Competition;
- to comply with the IPC Anti-Doping Code and, in particular not to take, possess and traffic any substance or use methods prohibited by the applicable World Anti-Doping Code Prohibited List. I also agree that third parties, including law enforcement and border services agencies may share my personal information with the IPC to assist in the enforcement of the IPC Anti-Doping Code;
- not to participate or assist in any gambling or betting activities associated with any IPC event; specifically I will not bet on myself, my team or any competitor or opponent (whether to lose or win), I will prevent members of my family or friends from doing so, I will not share any performance information relating to competitors taking part in an IPC Event with anybody, and I will never accept money or any benefit in return for influencing the outcome of an event;
- to abide by all IPC rules and regulations for advertising, sponsorship display, propaganda and manufacturer trademarks on clothing and equipment for the IPC Competition; and
- consent to the collection and use of personal data and statistics in IPC approved research projects (e.g. athlete biographies questionnaires, filming, measures, medical encounters etc.) conducted during IPC Events.

ACCEPTANCE OF SPORTS TECHNICAL SUPREME AUTHORITY
I recognise and accept that the sports technical rules, being all rules which relate to competition, field-of-play and classification, for my sport during any IPC Competition are under the authority of the IPC and that any disputes which arise shall be resolved by the IPC whose decision on such matters is final and enforceable.

I acknowledge and accept that decisions relating to the sports technical or classification rules are not subject to further appeal beyond the decision made in the sport-specific appeal processes as set out in the respective sports technical rules or classification appeal processes as set out in the classification rules applicable to the respective IPC Competition for which I am competing. I shall not institute any claim, arbitration or litigation, or seek any other form of relief in any other court or tribunal in relation to such decisions.

ACCEPTANCE OF BINDING ARBITRATION
I acknowledge and accept that any dispute outside the realm of the sports technical rules arising during the IPC Competitions shall be submitted exclusively to the Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS). Any such dispute shall be determined in accordance with the CAS Code for Sports-Related Arbitration, save for competitions covered by the CAS Ad hoc arbitration rules where I agree that the Ad hoc rules shall govern the procedure for dispute resolution. The decisions of CAS are final, non-appealable and enforceable.

ACCEPTANCE OF RISK AND RELEASE OF CLAIMS
I acknowledge that I participate in the IPC Competitions at my own risk; I will take all reasonable measures to protect myself and other competitors, officials and spectators from suffering injury or other harm. I also acknowledge that I am responsible for all equipment, adaptive equipment and property I bring on to all IPC Competition sites and that the Local Organising Committees and the IPC accept no responsibility for any loss or damage to, or arising from, such equipment, adaptive equipment or property.

I release the LOCs, the IPC, the international body governing my sport(s), and their respective executive members, directors, officers, employees, volunteers, contractors or agents, from any liability (to the extent permitted by law) for any loss, injury or damage suffered by me in relation to my participation in any IPC Competitions.
