



TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF PARTICIPATING AS A PRESENTER IN VICTORY CEREMONIES DURING PARIS 2024 PARALYMPIC GAMES

PERSONAL DATA

In providing Victory Ceremony Presenter information for the Paris 2024 Paralympic Games ("Games"), in accordance with the data protection laws applicable to the Games, I acknowledge that my organisation's details, my name, title, accessibility requirements, phone number, e-mail address, photo and other information provided (including the e-mail and contact details of any third party) in the Victory Ceremony Presenter Information Form (hereafter "Personal Data") is being collected by the International Paralympic Committee ("IPC") and is being stored and used by the IPC (including being transferred to or stored on the IPC's owned or contracted servers), for the purposes of, and to the extent necessary in relation to, facilitating participation in, organising and promoting the Games.

I acknowledge that the Personal Data provided may be transferred by the IPC for validation to the Responsible Organisation who submitted an application for accreditation and/or guest pass ("Accredited Person for the Paris 2024 Paralympic Games"), and that such transfer may require the IPC to transfer the Personal Data outside the European Union into other countries, which may include countries that may not afford the same level of protection of such data as the country from which you provided the information. In such cases, the IPC will take measures to ensure your Personal Data is protected in accordance with these Terms and the applicable law. Additionally, I confirm I have read and consent to the *Information notice: Paris 2024 Paralympic Games Accreditation terms and conditions* (see <https://www.paralympic.org/paris-2024/guides-and-policies>) and *Recommended Etiquette for Paralympic Victory Ceremonies*.

I also acknowledge, that some of my Personal Data (my organisation's details, my name, title, accessibility requirements, photo) will be transferred by the IPC to the Paris 2024 Organising Committee for the Olympic and Paralympic Games ("Paris 2024") for the necessary logistics, protocol and other requirements pertaining to my involvement in victory ceremony/ceremonies at the Games. The legal basis for the processing and transfer of data is the fulfilment of the contract for participation in the Games.

CAPTURE AND USE OF IMAGES

I acknowledge and understand that as an Accredited Person, I will be filmed and photographed at the occasion of the Games. I hereby expressly grant to the IPC and Paris 2024 the right, privilege and license to use my picture, image, voice and/or likeness or information related thereto in any photograph, movie, video production, livestream or any other forms of media and digital publication. Images of Accredited Persons taken at this occasion may be used together with related information as part of the media coverage of the Games, or otherwise to inform the public about the Games, the Paralympic Games in general and to promote the

Paralympic Movement. I confirm I have read and consent to the Paris 2024 Paralympic Games Accreditation terms and conditions: ANNEX 2 particular to the capture and use of images for the Games.

RIGHTS OF ACCREDITED PERSONS

I understand that I have a right to access and correct the Personal Data submitted through this Form by contacting the IPC at: victoryceremony@paralympic.org.

I also have the right to request the erasure of my Personal Data or the restriction of processing. Regarding the data I provide for the Games, I understand that I have the right to data portability. I can withdraw the consent at any time without giving reason. In that case the IPC will take appropriate and reasonable measures to delete the information. I understand this will stop processes that would facilitate my involvement in victory ceremony/ceremonies at the Games as an Accredited Person and may result in me not being able to participate in the victory ceremony/ceremonies during the Games.
